Lesson Description

Overview	Students will choose a topic related to turtles and write a children's book intended for			
	Grade 1 students. Students will conduct any necessary research as well as illustrate the			
	book.			
Activity	 Provide a list of topics that students may choose to write and illustrate their book about. If desired, students may create their own topic as well. Suggested topics include: Turtle Life Cycle, Importance of Turtles, Water Cycle, Conservation, Where Turtles Live, The Different Species of Ontario Turtles, How to Help a Turtle, etc. If desired, split the class into groups of two to complete this assignment. This can also be done individually. Hand out the attached worksheet for students to follow along with as they complete their research and rough draft of the book. After a rough draft is complete, the instructor should review the draft to ensure it is appropriate for Grade 1 students to understand. After approval form the instructor, students should begin creating the final version of the book, complete with illustrations. Finally, organize a time with a Grade 1 class for the Grade 8 students to read their books to them.
