

Snapping Turtle



- Long tail with three rows of triangular upright scales.
- Shell is tan/ brown/ black and is often covered with algae.
- Head is large, top half of beak (mouth) hooks over lower half.

Blanding's Turtle



- Distinct bright yellow chin.
- Shell is dark green to black and highly domed, and can have light yellow flecks.
- Yellow belly shell has large black blotches.

Midland Painted Turtle



- Smooth black or olive green shell with red markings along the edges.
- Face and legs are striped yellow and red.
- Belly shell is yellow with no markings.

Eastern Musk Turtle (Stinkpot)



- Small turtle with distinct pointed nose.
- Shell is brown or black, often covered in algae, and is domed.
- Two light yellow stripes run along each side of its face.

Northern Map Turtle



- Brown/ olive shell with lines that resemble contour lines of a map.
- Shell is low, and jagged at the back.
- Face and body have yellow lines that resemble contour lines on a map.

Spotted Turtle



- Small turtle with smooth black shell and distinct yellow spots.
- Orange to yellow markings on its head and limbs.

Wood Turtle



- Shell is yellow to brown and has a sculpted look (not flat).
- Shell resembles wood.
- Orange to yellow colouring on neck and front legs.
